


The Monthly Lasallian World Youth Day Bulletin



The city of Krakow was founded more than a thousand years ago. The legend says that a mythical ruler, Krakus, founded the city on the Wawel Hill after killing the dragon that inhabited it. It has always been a very important city in Poland and continues to be so up until now. Its Historic Centre has also been declared World Heritage Site by UNESCO, and Karol Wojtyła was archbishop of Krakow before eventually becoming Pope John Paul II in 1978.
