


The Monthly Lasallian World Youth Day Bulletin



The World Youth Day was initiated by Pope John Paul II in 1985, on the occasion of the International Year of Youth, established by the United Nations. Since then, international World Youth Days have been held every two or three years, and events are held in all dioceses every year on Palm Sunday. Members of the International Council of Young Lasallians were in the Vatican this year for this World Youth Day celebration presided by Pope Francis.
